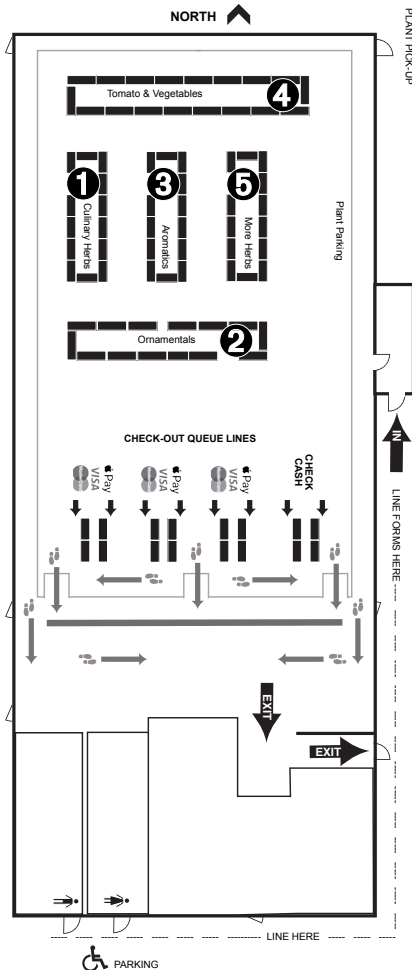

- Yes, shoppers line up at 6:30 AM! *Please bring patience.* We're doing our best to get people through check-out as fast as we can. Busiest time: 9:15 to 10:30 AM.
- **STAY SAFE.** We **STRONGLY** discourage bringing **garden sleds** to carry plants. They are close to the ground and hard to see which **poses a tripping hazard.**



- **Plant Parking.** "Park" your plants and continue shopping.
- **Plant Pick-Up.** We'll take your purchases from check-out to the outside Pick-Up area and help you load them into your vehicle.

CARING FOR YOUR NEW PLANTS (HARDENING-OFF)

Your tender plants need tiny steps to acclimate to their new environment (hardening-off). They won't survive the extremes of the outdoors without your gentle guidance. Here is a hardening-off guide produced by the UW-Madison Extension.

- On a mild day (temperatures above 40° F), set your plants in a sheltered location with 1-2 hours of sunshine. **THIS IS WISCONSIN, COLD WEATHER CAN STILL HAPPEN.**
- Each day increase exposure to sunlight a few additional hours at a time, keeping them out of harsh winds, direct sun, and cold rains in early stages.
- As they strengthen, they will withstand stronger breezes and cooler rains.
- Gradually reduce the frequency of watering, but don't allow them to wilt.
- If temperatures below the plant's minimum are forecast, bring plants indoors or cover them to protect them from damage.
- After transplanting to your garden, water them with a weak fertilizer to get them growing again and to help avoid transplant shock.
